

TOPIC OF THE MONTH

SESHA 2017 Symposium: Long Time Listener, First Time Caller

As a 17 year veteran of EHS in the semiconductor industry, I hesitate to admit I had never been to a SESHA conference until this year. And what a year it was! The 2017 SESHA symposium showed registration and exhibitor participation at the best levels seen in a decade.

The week kicked off with a tribute to long-time member Liz Aton, a touching reminder that SESHA is a community of motivated and connected individuals with a common purpose to make the world better through EHS improvements in and through high technology. The first day keynote provided market context to direct us to the future: China is this year's wildcard, R&D is a unique component of our industry, and our world is becoming exponentially more connected from cars to homes to energy infrastructure. The second day keynote dove into the importance of the IC industry in a connected energy sector both as an energy consumer as well as a critical component of emerging energy sources such as solar, wind, and clean fuels. The third day keynote took us on a story-telling journey

underscoring the importance EHS plays in sending employees home safely every day.

The specific content sessions provided ample subject matter from which to choose. The supply chain tract brought together device and chemical manufacturers to speak about the challenges of material substitution in an ever-evolving regulatory landscape. With a chemical and tool development process that can last 10 to 15 years, collaboration and early alignment are more important than ever. The GHG tract provided information on emerging abatement devices, emission factors, and exhaust management. An academic review of the gap between atmospheric measurements and emission inventories of CF4 turned session participants into GHG detectives. Expert reviews of fluorinated material and EHS reporting regulation updates sent participants away with questions to answer and processes to check.

Most importantly, the 2017 SESHA symposium provided an opportunity for key partners within the IC industry to meet (face-to-face), learn, and align on the key aspects of our mission moving into the future.
